

2018 Nondiscrimination Policy Reminder

Dear HCE Members and Community Partners

Periodically, UW-Extension, Cooperative Extension takes steps to assure that our partners know and understand our policy of nondiscrimination. Mandi gave the Advisor's Report on Family Living programs and administration reminders for 2018. Mandi asked if we could eliminate post cards. It was decided we would try it. Mandi is still looking for volunteers to play board games with Headstart students. Presidents will bring request to clubs and will let Mandi know by Nov. 1^{st.}

We voted to change the Annual Meeting from November to October. Joan made a motion to make the change; seconded by Fran. Motion carried to change Article v11 Section 1.

We looked at the Leader Training for 2017 because attendance is so low. Suggestions were to have Leader Training following meetings or only have if they reach the minimum. It was decided to open them to all members.

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Motion carried. We are still in need of Chairpersons for Cultural Arts, International, and Marketing.

Meeting was adjourned at 2:55pm, followed by the Homemakers Prayer.

2017 Stitches of Love Annual Report

The Winnebago County Association of Home & Community Education Stitches of Love project, which began in January 2002, is proud to be completing its 16th year of service. The mission of Stitches of Love is to make headwear, free of

charge, for local cancer patients and distribute them through local treatment centers. In 2017, six regional cancer centers received our knit, crocheted, and sewn hats:

- ThedaCare Cancer Center in Appleton
- Fox Valley Hematology & Oncology in Appleton
- Fox Valley Hematology & Oncology in Oshkosh
- The Vince Lombardi Cancer Center at Aurora Medical Center in Oshkosh
- The Cancer Center at Mercy Medical Center in Oshkosh, and
- The Agnesian Cancer Center in Fond du Lac

Stitches of Love holds six workshops each year, four at the Coughlin Center in Oshkosh and two at the Calumet County Courthouse in Chilton.

During the workshops, fabric hats are cut out and then taken home by volunteers to sew. A number of volunteers also sew or knit or crochet hats at home. In 2017 we donated 3,328 hats along with 188 fabric flowers with the time and talents of our 35+ dedicated volunteers. All of this was done with well over 6,000 hours of volunteer time.

Stitches of Love revenue comes primarily from the ThedaCare Medical Center Foundation, donations, and the sale of walker caddies through ThedaCare at Home. We welcome financial donations as well as donations of yarn, cotton fabric, t-shirt fabric, and heavy fabrics for our walker caddies. Finally, we are also very thankful for the support given to us by the staff at the Coughlin Center – Amy, Ashley and Carol along with an incredible facility, both in Oshkosh and in Chilton, for our workshops.

And finally, a big <u>Thank You</u> to Winnebago County Association of Home & Community Education for supporting this most worthwhile cause!!







Food Recalls & Safety Notices

Recently, Cooperative Extension has shared a variety of food recalls due to confirmed cases of Listeria and Salmonella. Winnebago County UW-Extension has been sharing articles regarding food recalls and safety on our website and on social media. Visit our website (<u>https://winnebago.uwex.edu/</u>) for more details regarding which brands and locations have been included in the recalls.

Salmonella Notice:

• Sprouted seeds (sprouts) served by Jimmy Johns

Symptoms of Salmonella infection may include headache, muscle aches, diarrhea, vomiting, abdominal cramping, chills, fever, nausea and dehydration. Symptoms usually appear 6 to 72 hours after ingesting the bacteria, but it can take longer for them to develop. Most illnesses resolve on their own and do not require

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treatment other than drinking fluids to stay hydrated. Anyone who experiences persistent or severe symptoms should contact a healthcare provider.

Listeria Recalls/Notice:

- Frozen meatballs
- Ice Cream Bars: orange cream bars, raspberry cream bars, and chocolate-coated vanilla bars
- Frozen buttermilk biscuits
- Frozen green beans

Symptoms can include fever, muscle aches, headache, stiff neck, confusion, loss of balance, and convulsions, sometimes preceded by diarrhea or other gastrointestinal symptoms.



In severe cases the infection becomes invasive and spreads beyond the gastrointestinal tract. Older adults, young children, and people with weakened immune systems such as cancer patients, people with HIV/AIDS, and organ

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
transplant recipients are susceptible to serious, sometimes fatal, infections. In addition, in pregnant women, infection with Listeria can cause miscarriages, stillbirths, premature delivery, or life-threatening infection of the newborn. The pathogen can cross the placenta and infect developing fetuses.

According to Food Safety News, it can take up to 70 days after exposure for symptoms of Listeria infection to develop. Consequently, people who have eaten any of the recalled food items should monitor themselves for listeriosis symptoms during the coming weeks.
